caramel corn samples were among the choices available. Wannabe lumberjacks swung their mauls into logs of challenging circumference and musicians tested out instruments at the Brightwood Music booth. Young firefighters-in-training aimed water hoses at two miniature plywood cutout houses with four windows each. When all the mock flames in the windows were knocked down by the stream of water the fire was doused and adjacent forest saved.

The Dog Agility Contest was a hit with a course that began with a low foam jump, then a teeter-totter followed by a long tube that the dog was supposed to pass through. The owners would toss a treat inside one end then run to the other coaxing the animal through. Often the canines were smarter than the humans were, popping out of the end that they started, hoping for another treat. A ramp and a slide led to a kiddie pool filled with water in which the dogs

were required to enter but usually took a prolonged drink. The "Ring of Fire," another tube, and weave poles brought animals and owners to the finish line. None of the dogs but one had ever seen an obstacle course before and the fun was in seeing what the animals would and would not do.

The backbone of any fair is the equestrian events, brought to us


