

Chicken chipotle chili

We all love a nice bowl of warm chili on a cold winter evening, right? This recipe is just perfect for that. You can make it ahead of time and leave it in the crockpot, cooking on low, for the day.

Ingredients:

1 Tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil 1 medium white onion, peeled, and diced

1 poblano pepper, cored and diced

1 red bell pepper, cored and diced

4 cloves garlic, minced 2 chipotles in adobo, roughly chopped

4 cups chicken stock

2 cups shredded cooked chicken 15 ounce can pinto beans 15 ounce can red kidney beans 15 ounce can fire-roasted diced tomatoes

15 ounce can tomato sauce 2 teaspoon ground cumin salt and pepper, to taste

Marinate chicken overnight with your favorite spices (I add a tablespoon of bourbon to the marinade). Grill chicken and cut to bite size pieces.

Place all fresh veggies in a fry pan with olive oil. Cook for 7 minutes. Add chipotles and cook for another minute. Pour into a crock pot. Add chicken, beans, tomatoes, and tomato sauce. Add cumin.

Cook on low for 4 to 8 hours.

Tastes great topped with shredded cheese, diced avocado, finely-chopped red onions, chopped cilantro, or sour cream. Enjoy!



to take on a Clear Creek athlete twenty pounds heavier than himself. In a gritty hard-fought contest, the Eagles' wrestler lost the decision by points in a match that lasted the full three periods.

In his third and final match of the day, in a back-and-forth battle, Bloom again grappled the full three periods just losing to his rival from Goldenview Classical by a score of 12-9.

After feeling each other out, Gilpin's 245-pound heavyweight Neko Cope fended off a takedown attempt and found himself in a scramble against his Goldenview opponent. Upon gaining the upper hand, Cope quickly applied the pressure. With the referee on all fours, head to the floor, and his eyes focused on the compromised

wrestler's shoulder blades, he slapped his hand to the mat, declaring a pin for Cope at 1:14 of the first period.

It took Cope one more second to dispatch his next opponent from Clear Creek in his second match. Tied up in headlock holds with each of their hands behind the other's neck, they mightily pushed back and forth trying to establish dominance. A throw by Cope was slightly off, resulting in finding the Clear Creek wrestler on his back. He wasted little time in reversing his position and imposing his will for the pin. Cope's overall record is now 5-3.

Head Coach Jonathan Chamberlin after the tournament said, "I'm proud of our guys coming out and doing their best. To complement his pin and narrow loss, Ezekiel showed great determination against a heavier opponent. Neko's two pins on the day indicate that he may be hitting his stride. We are excited for our guys as we get closer to regionals for a chance to wrestle at Ball Arena."
